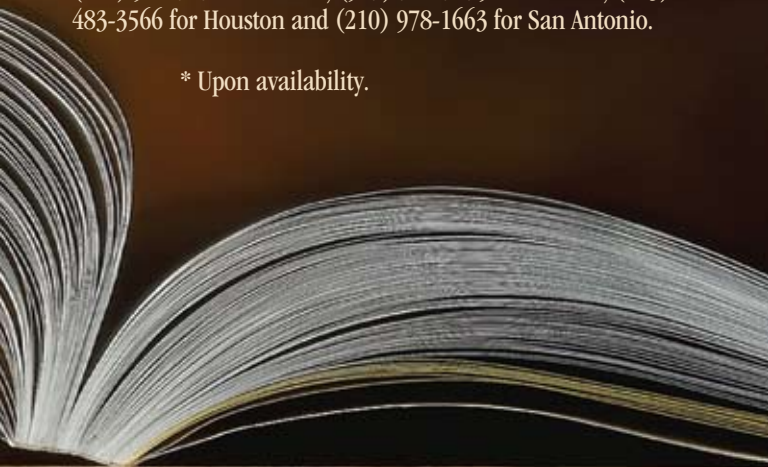
Economics Boot Camp

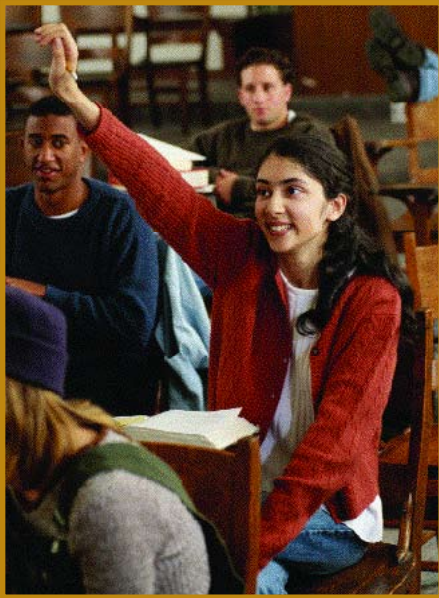
Two-and-a-half-day workshop designed for teachers new to the subject of economics; offered in all four office locations.
