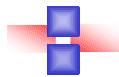

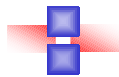
**Established advisory boards and internal boards,

- New department

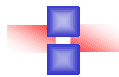
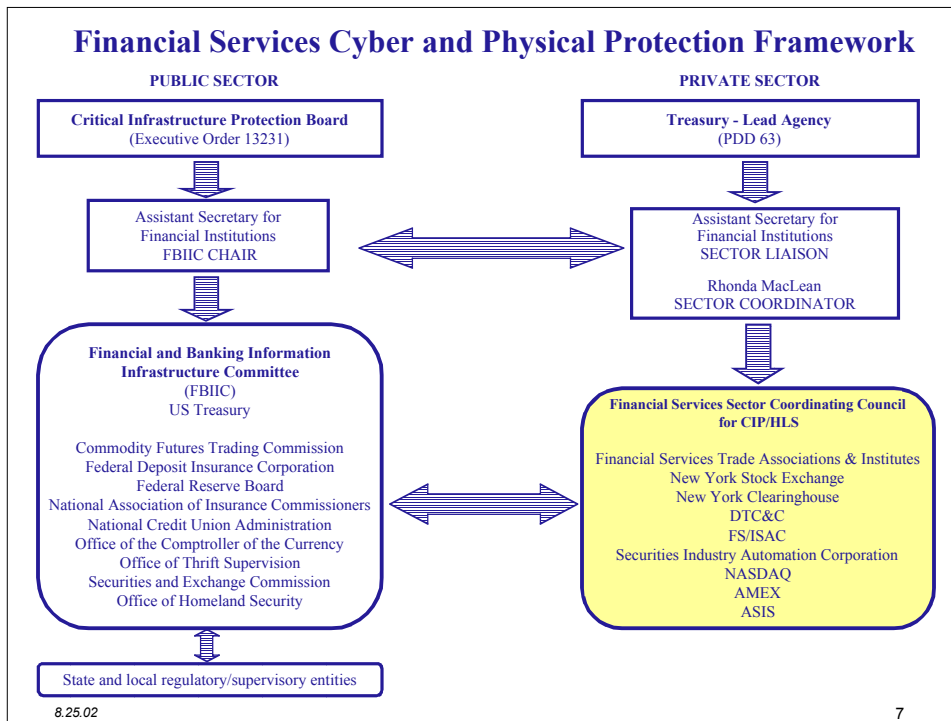

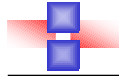

- Critical Infrastructure Protection (CIP) and Homeland Security (HLS)

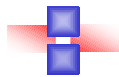
#### Mission
