Income inequality, household characteristics determine 'reasonable' service prices

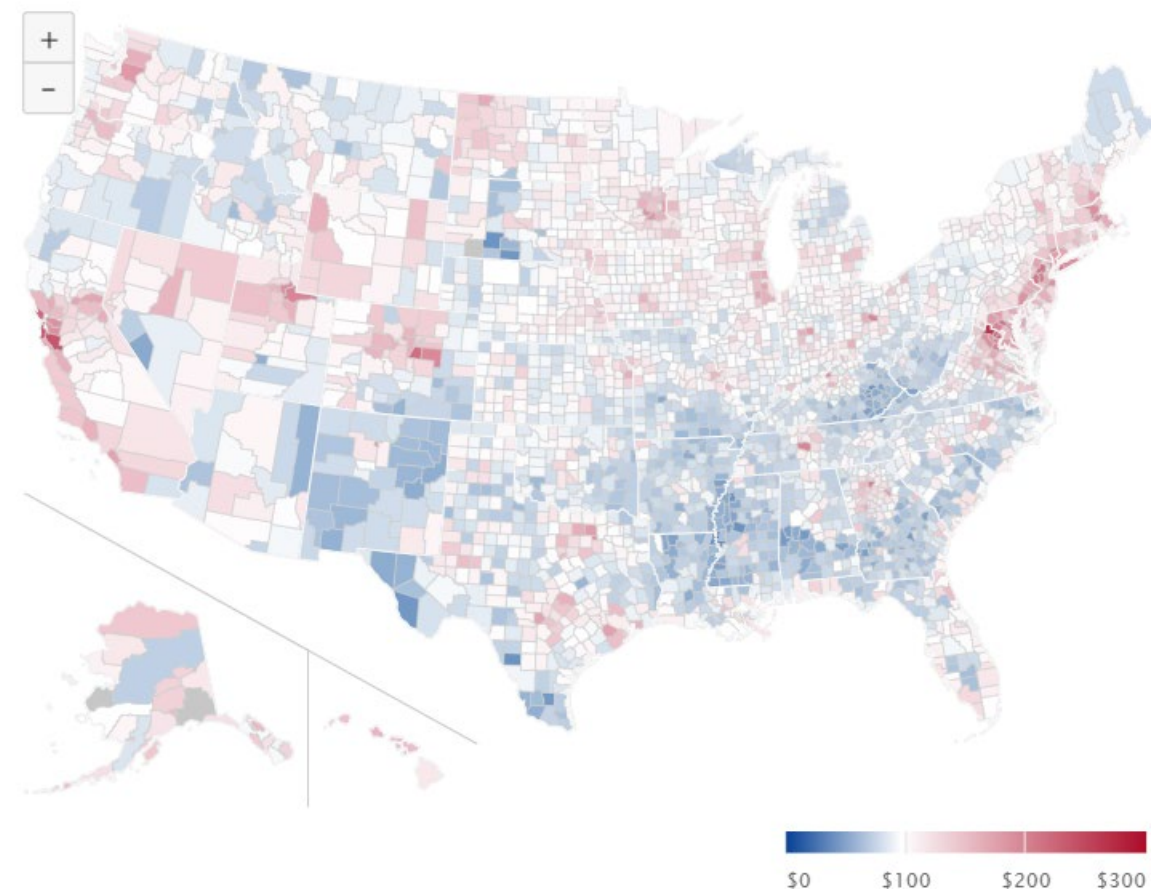

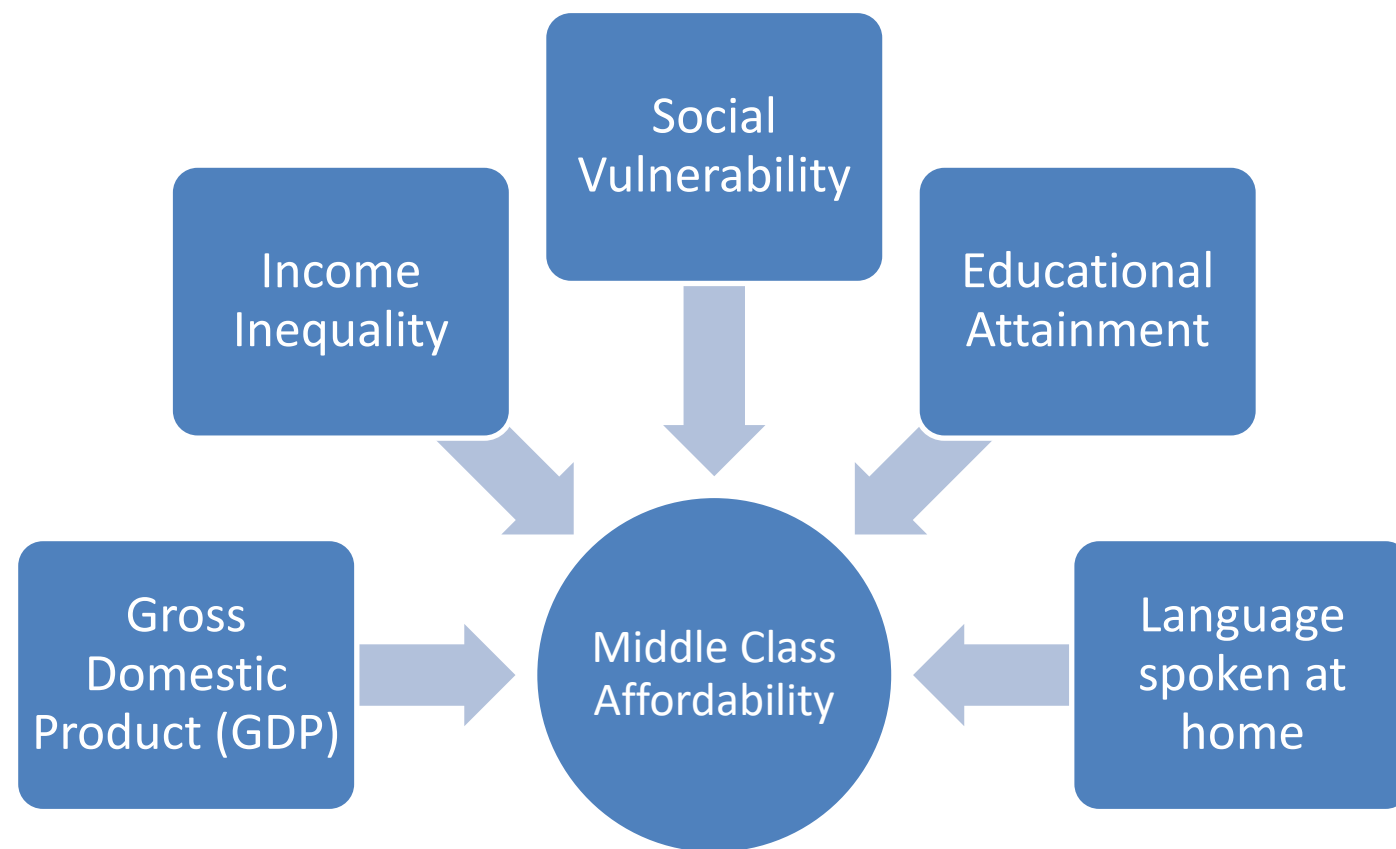

Significant variation in broadband affordability based on income

- Federal Communication Commissions' 2% benchmark
 - NOTE: For comparative purposes, NOT a policy recommendation
- Differences both between and within states
- Problem for policymakers: Addressing affordability while encouraging accountability for pricing disparities



Factors Influencing Local Affordability

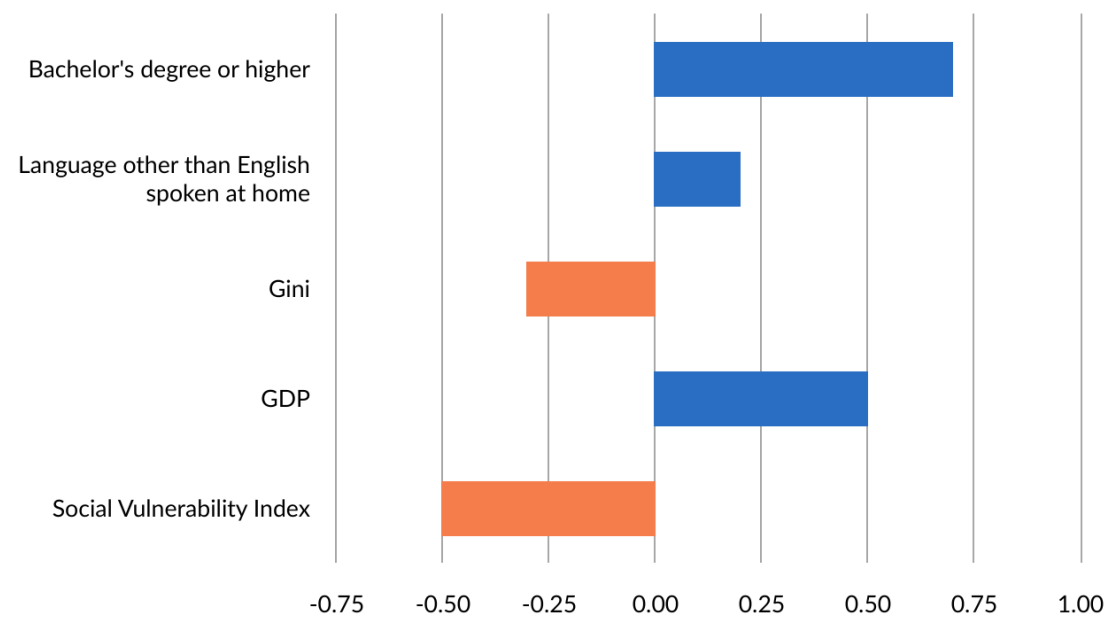


Social Vulnerability & Inequality Help Identify Communities Needing Low Internet Prices

Correlation of five indicators with broadband affordability

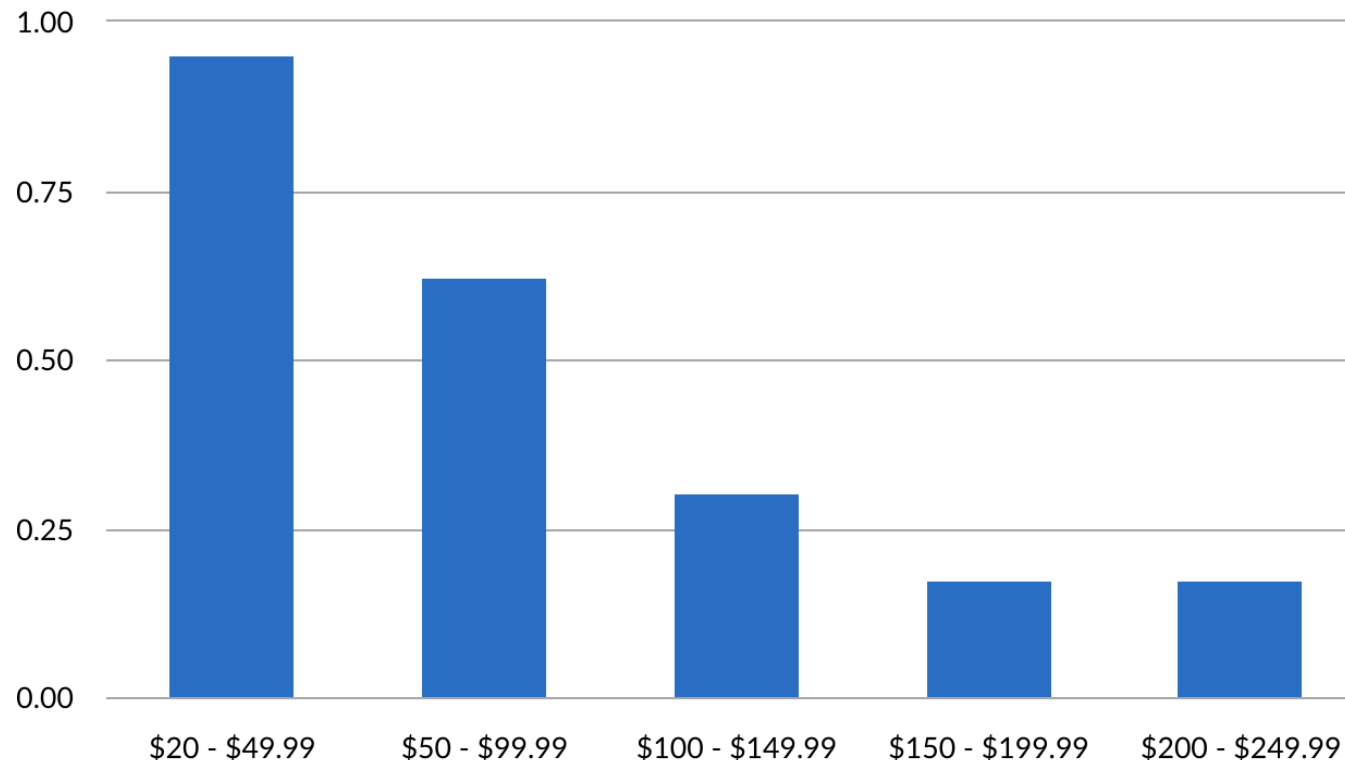


As Social Vulnerability Increases, Affordable Broadband Prices Decline

Social vulnerability and affordable broadband price ranges, for all U.S. counties

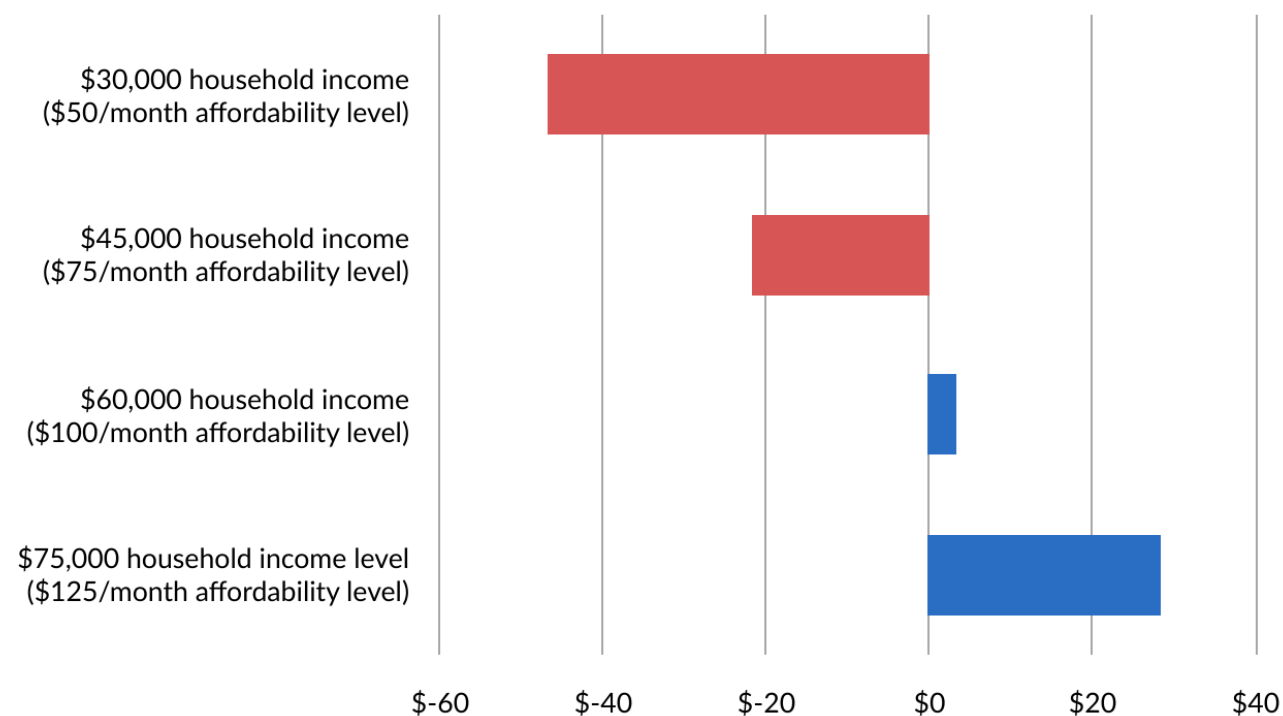


Affordability Measures in the Context of Household Income

Median Middle-Class Broadband Price of \$96.63 Is Unaffordable for Families Earning \$60,000 a Year or Less

Pricing gaps by household income, based on the 2% standard



BEAD Planning and Broadband Affordability

Broad themes across BEAD's Initial Proposal Volume II Plans:

- Establishing affordability benchmarks based on *regional* data
- Structuring grant scoring to incentivize subgrantee behavior
- Adding transparency to the marketplace through public reporting of broadband prices

Considerations for Policymakers

Localized data is critical: Incorporate local social and economic demographics into grant scoring metrics for BEAD and state broadband grant applications to better reflect middle class affordability across the state

Customize affordability policies: Consider multiple factors when crafting affordability plans to avoid pricing out targeted households
