

Advancing Digital Inclusion

Advancing Digital Inclusion: Round 2

Rural and urban communities face different obstacles in connecting all residents to affordable internet, devices, and digital skilling opportunities.

But both need a viable pipeline of investible deals and an understanding of/access to **different financing tools to fund projects**.

Through a two-track model, the Dallas Fed will help communities find innovative ways to finance digital inclusion projects.

Track 1:
Major Metros

Track 2:
Small/ Medium Sized Communities

Track 2: Broadband Buildout Initiative (BBI)

The BBI will provide technical support to four communities into 2025.

Goal:

Build infrastructure to unserved households

Technical Assistance Provider:

Connect Humanity

Support:

- Forge partnerships with mission-aligned internet service providers; and
- Develop a capital stack that brings together diverse sources of funding to bear the higher cost of financing network builds in less densely populated areas.

BBI Selection Process

- Communities will be chosen by an independent selection committee.
- Members of this group are drawn from the Digital Inclusion Advisory Committee.
- The Fed **will not** participate in the selection committee deliberations and decision-making process.
- Selection committee members will be reviewed for potential conflicts of interest with applicants and any potential conflicts of interest will be resolved and managed prior to the selection process.

Application

- Community info (geography)
- Primary contact
- Partnership profile (roles, responsibilities)
- Broadband project (summary of progress, challenges)
- Attachments (assessments, plans, studies, models, etc.)

Selection criteria

Selection Principles:

- Demonstrates characteristics of historically marginalized, persistent poverty, and/or economically distressed
- Material progress in broadband planning basics
- Likelihood TA will result in deployment
- App is minimal effort for communities

Preliminary Criteria:

- Applicant has clear champion and decision-maker
- Demonstrated planning progress and clear articulation of challenge(s)
- Demonstrated partnerships and CAIs
- Preliminary thoughts on funding

Evaluation

- Applicant profile – 20 points
- Project profile – 60 points
- Community support– 10 points

Early Questions

Q: What are the intended outcomes for selected communities?

A: Communities will deploy infrastructure to underserved households

Q: What community size is eligible to apply?

A: Small/ medium sized communities are welcome to apply. The selection committee will consider how many households your project will serve (<100,000)

Q: How long will the Dallas Fed support the selected communities?

A: Wrap up in 2025

Q: Do I need to have an ISP identified for my project?

A: No, but it would be helpful to know what ISPs in your community could be potential partners.

Early Questions

Q: Can I submit the application even if I don't have all the documents?

A: Yes! Note, the more documents you have, you'll likely receive more points during the selection process.

Q: What is the total budget for the grant?

A: This is not a cash grant; it is a technical assistance initiative.

Q: May a local government apply?

A: Yes.

Q: Must the applicant be an ISP?

A: No.

Q: Do I need to have a feasibility study completed?

A: Yes.

Early Questions

Q: Is my community a part of the Dallas Fed District? Am I eligible to apply?

A: All counties in Texas are eligible. Below are the counties and parishes covered by the Dallas Fed in New Mexico and Louisiana.

Early Questions

Q: Are you looking for a county to apply or can my application be regional?

A: We welcome applications that cover single communities, counties, or are regional. We will only accept one application per area. Confirm with stakeholders in your region before you apply.

Q: I'm an ISP. How would you suggest we get involved in your current initiative?

A: First, check if the area you serve has a digital inclusion coalition/non-profit and consider partnering with them to apply. If you are not aware, reach out to the Dallas Fed team and we can connect about other potential opportunities.

Q: What can we expect after we submit our application?
