The Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System has published slip-sheet amendments to Regulation A (*Extensions of Credit by Federal Reserve Banks*), effective November 17, 1998, and Regulation H (*Membership of State Banking Institutions in the Federal Reserve System*), effective November 2, 1998.

In addition, the Board has published slip-sheet amendments to the *Capital Adequacy Guidelines*, effective October 1, 1998, and to the Official Staff Commentary on Regulation Z (*Truth in Lending*).


